All About Genes, from Mechanisms to Morals

On Monday, January 15, 2001, Dr. David Schafer will satisfy a request of several members by answering the question: what is all this gene and DNA business, anyhow?

For those not familiar with our founder's career, he developed a molecular diagnostics (DNA) laboratory at the West Haven VA Medical Center during 1997 and 1998. This would explain why anyone would ask him such a question! He also has decades of experience as an educator, so expect to be able to follow along.

David plans to explain the fundamentals of what a gene is, what a genome is, what a chromosome is, what DNA is, what DNA is made of and how it is constructed, what DNA does and what is the result of gene action, how the products of gene action (expression) are involved in the formation of an organism (human or other), how the products are involved in the function of the organism, and how these functions work together to create complex functions, including some that appear to control aspects of human behavior, even some that we may regard as moral determinants.
