August 20th: Globalization

In August the monthly meeting will feature a panel and open discussion on the timely and vitally important subject of "Globalization." Panelists will include members Frank Vernava and Walter Giger, and guest Justin Rubin, who is doing research on globalization at Yale.

Among topics slated for particular attention will be the book *Empire*, by Michael Hardt and Antonio Negri, which some reviewers have hailed as a brilliant new synthesis of political economics at the start of the new millennium. As a lead-in to the main program, member Mickey Koth will give a short talk on "Why I Am a Humanist."

The high costs of prescription drugs affect us all. For many, drugs are a major cost of living, alongside food and housing, and some simply can't pay for the medicines needed. Drug costs are the fastest growing part of healthcare, and today's advances in biology make possible a proliferation of costly drugs far greater than what we have today. In addition, the pharmaceutical companies are making record profits and these companies are charging people in other countries much less than Americans pay for the exact same products.

At next month's meeting, Manny Ratafia will discuss how the costs of medications are affected by doctors, pharmaceutical and biotech companies, employers, governments and your behavior as a consumer.

Manny has consulted and published reports on biotechnology, pharmaceuticals and other technology-based industries. His reports have been
