Saving Threatened Species; Creating Third-World Jobs

Our speaker on March 17 will be Jon Miceler, who manages to combine adventurer, entrepreneur, and environmentalist in a single person. Jon spends alternate months in Hamden and the politically highly sensitive corner of south Asia where Myanmar (formerly Burma), China's Xizang (Tibet), and India's Arunachal Pradesh (formerly the Northeast Frontier Agency) intersect. He will speak to us having just returned from his most recent adventure, and will tell us how his imaginative approach to the economic and environmental problems of the 21st century is taking shape. Jon travels with a group of porters into the jungles where rare and even previously unknown species are to be found. When he is not accompanying world-famous naturalist George Schaller he is usually the sole Caucasian making the trek. Not long ago he received one of the prized MacArthur awards, thus being able to spend several years focusing on this interest. (He hastened to add that this was not one of the "genius" awards, but
