Attacking Freedom:

How Evangelicals War on American Pluralism

“Sixteen hundred years ago, evangelicals succeeded in destroying western civilization. Today in America, they’re mounting a second assault.”

This is how Brian Trent addresses the latest title-fight between religious fundamentalism and rationality, with particular focus on the last days of the classical world in Alexandria, the murder of its celebrated humanist, and what this may mean for today’s political stage.

Brian Trent is a writer of many interests. In 2004, his essays appeared in three consecutive issues of *The Humanist* magazine. One of these articles, “Technology and Tomorrow: A Challenge to Liberty,” was selected for publisher H.W. Wilson’s book, *U.S. National Debate Topic 2005-06*.
