David & June Schafer, Humanist Heroes

Join us Monday, May 21, at 7:30 p.m. at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden when the Humanist Association of Connecticut's vice-president, Rev. Douglas Peary, will return with a very special addition to his "Humanist Heroes" series. This month his subject will be our very own Dr. David and June Schafer.

Dr. David and June Schafer were cofounders with Rev. Robert and Joan Rafford of The Humanist Association of Central Connecticut in 1989. The name was later changed to The Humanist Association of Connecticut. David and June have continuously held major roles in the direction of our organization.

They were born five days apart in Wichita Kansas in 1931 and were placed in the same bed. Their parents went in different directions so they didn't know each other until age 13. Their youth was filled with achievement; their young adulthood was filled with exceptional education. Married in 1949, they had a son and daughter, and later went to India where they worked to cure disease and educate children of the streets and of the well-to-do.

They brought Indian youth to America, treated them as family, and aided in their advanced education. David and June's lives were spent in medicine and education. They have been active in Unitarian Universalism, Humanism, and social action all of their lives, and still are, after 63 years of marriage.

We will start with half an hour of coffee and conversation at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, May 21, at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. Doug's talk will follow brief announcements at 8:00 p.m.

Start with a potluck dinner beginning promptly at 6:30 p.m., then at 7:00 watch Charles Ferguson's acclaimed 2010 documentary of the truth behind the devastating economic crisis of 2008. "Inside Job" was the first and is still one of the best films attempting to explain exactly what happened to cause the financial disaster with the after-effects that continue to plague the economies of the world. Called "the film that cost over \$20,000,000,000,000 to make," and hailed as "a crime story like no other in history" and "a powerhouse of a documentary that will leave you both thunderstruck and boiling with rage," it won many coveted critical prizes, including an Academy Award in 2011 for Best Documentary, Features.

From **New Haven**: Take I-91 N to exit 15 for CT-68 toward Yalesville/Durham. In 0.3 mi. turn right onto CT-68. In 0.9 miles route 68 takes a left. Follow 68 for 4.2 miles, when you will turn left onto CT-17 (Main St.) Take your 2nd right (0.5 mile) onto Haddam Quarter Rd. In 1.7 miles turn left at Arbutus St. In 1.4 miles bear right onto Livingston Rd. In 0.6 miles turn left into the park. The pavilion will be on your left.

From **Hartford**: Take I-91 S and take exit 22S on the left to merge onto CT-9 S toward Middletown. Take exit 11. At the end of the exit turn left onto CT-155 (Randolph Rd.) toward CT-17/Durham. In 0.7 mile, turn left at Millbrook Rd. (there's a traffic light and a fire station on your left). In 1.4 miles turn right onto Livingston Rd. then turn right into the park. The pavilion will be on your left.
