We will view and discuss two short DVDs showing complementary presentations by Michelle Alexander, author of this year's UUA Common Read, The New Jim Crow: Mass Incarceration in the Age of Colorblindness. Alexander is an associate professor of law at Ohio State University and former director of the ACLU's Racial Justice Project in Northern California. She is also a riveting speaker. In her book's superbly documented account she argues persuasively that our "justice" system has become a legal system for institutionalized racism, discrimination, and exclusion.
