Join us on Monday evening for a presentation on ALEC, the American Legislative Exchange Council in the Social Hall of the Unitarian Society of New Haven at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden. ALEC describes itself as a non-partisan, non-profit organization. But what goes on behind closed doors? Corporations on ALEC task forces vote on "model" bills and resolutions, and sit as equals with legislators voting on the ALEC task forces and various working groups. Who are some of the members? ExxonMobile, The Koch Foundation, and Castle Rock Foundation (Coors), to name a few. Alumni? John Boehner, Tom Delay, Donald Rumsfeld, and Scott Walker have been members. Explorations: Broadway Musicals: A Jewish Legacy -- July 6, 2:30 p.m.

This PBS documentary, narrated by Joel Grey, explores the unique role of Jewish composers and lyricists in the creation of the modern American musical. Featuring interviews and conversations with some of the greatest composers and writers of the Broadway stage, this film showcases the work of some of the nation's pre-eminent creators of musical theatre including Irving Berlin, Jerome Kern, George and Ira Gershwin, Lorenz Hart, Richard Rodgers, Oscar Hammerstein II, Leonard Bernstein, Stephen Sondheim, and many others.
