#### Monday Jun 15th, at 7 p.m.

Manuela Wagner is a specialist in the integration of Intercultural Competence and Intercultural Citizenship in world language education. In her presentation she will discuss the interplay of theory and the practice of implementing models of related theoretical frameworks (theories of criticality, intercultural communication, social justice, and intellectual humility). A new question she considers is how education can facilitate students' understanding of their own convictions.

## Monday Social (Wood-n-Tap) – Who Destroyed Three Mile Island? with host Carol Siddall

#### -- June 29, 7 p.m.

On March 28, 1979, at exactly 4 o'clock in the morning, control rods slammed into the reactor core of Three Mile Island Unit #2, halting the nuclear reaction because of a fault in the reactor cooling system. At 4:02, the automated emergency cooling system activated as the reactor core temperature continued to rise. At 4:04, one of the plant operators made the befuddling decision to switch off the emergency cooling system, dooming the reactor to partial meltdown. Why?
