

The IRIS Run for Refugees is back in-person! Join us on Super Bowl Sunday for a flat 5K run/walk through New Haven's East Rock neighborhood!

The Run for Refugees 5k supports IRIS (Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services). IRIS helps close to 2,000 refugees and immigrants each year. During the pandemic, IRIS helped more than 120 refugees and immigrants find work, provided \$200,000 in rental assistance, taught students English, art, and music, helped adults with immigration legal needs, and fed 300+ families per week with essential groceries from our food pantry.

Registration is limited to 2/3 of the usual number of participants to allow for increased distancing due to Covid.
