Covid Protocol Reminder & Additional Programming Notes



November Book Discussion Saturday, November 19, 2:30pm Wilson Branch Library, 303 Washington Ave., New Haven Book: "Woke Racism" by John McWhorter

According to [linguist] John McWhorter...a well-meaning but pernicious form of antiracism has become, not a progressive ideology, but a religion – one that's illogical, unreachable, and unintentionally neoracist.

In "Woke Racism," McWhorter reveals the workings of this new religion, from the original sin of "white privilege"... to the evangelical fervor of the "woke mob." The new religion might be called "antiracism," but it features a racial essentialism that's barely distinguishable from racist arguments of the past.

"Honest commentary about racial controversies is rare, and John McWhorter is a writer who can be counted on to provide it. Woke Racism is a heartfelt evisceration of the sloppy thinking that forms the foundation of so much social justice activism today." – Jason L. Riley, Wall Street Journal columnist


