
Cory Efram Doctorow is a Canadian-British blogger, journalist, and science fiction author.

"An Immense World" by Ed Yong

Our book for November is *An Immense World: How Animal Senses Reveal the Hidden Realms Around Us* by science journalist Ed Yong.



From Amazon: The Earth teems with sights and textures, sounds and vibrations, smells and tastes, electric and magnetic fields. But every kind of animal, including humans, is enclosed within its own unique sensory bubble, perceiving but a tiny sliver of our immense world.

In An Immense World, Ed Yong coaxes us beyond the confines of our own senses, allowing us to perceive the skeins of scent, waves of electromagnetism, and pulses of pressure that surround us. We encounter beetles that are drawn to fires, turtles that can track the Earth's magnetic

fields, fish that fill rivers with electrical messages, and even humans who wield sonar like bats.

Zoning Reform as Catalyst for Happy, Healthy Communities: A Chat with Robert Orr



Monday, November 20, 2023 6:30PM to 8:00PM

Join us for a lecture and conversation on the history of zoning, segregation, housing costs, community, polarization, and the power of place with architect, planner and leading "New Urbanist" thinker Robert Orr, FAIA.

Trained in architecture at Yale, followed by a ten-year apprenticeship with Philip Johnson and then Allan Greenberg, Robert Orr is the principal of Robert Orr & Associates, an architecture and planning firm based in New Haven, Connecticut. He has been a leading thinker and practitioner in the "New Urbanism" movement since its founding 40 years ago. Robert has served as President of the Congress for the New Urbanism — New England Chapter and taught architecture and planning in the graduate architecture

program at the University of Hartford. He received his M.Arch. from the Yale School of Art and Architecture and his BA from the University of Vermont. He has lectured on architecture, planning, placemaking and urbanism around the world. Robert lives with his wife in New Haven.
